
# **North Locality Group Notes**

# Lucy Adcock (6)




ASD Helping Hands has offices that are in Dereham

Train passes on phones have helped as you can avoid queues and get alerts if any changes are made to train times




Not enough access to housing




Waiting times for housing are long

### **Employment (1)**




Explore opportunities for employment and ongoing support

There has been positive new stories of people with LD getting job placements




Places such as Morrisons, Tesco, Norse and structure flex have employed people with LD
